Carolyn has been an active member of the Junior League of Hartford since 2002. She served as president from 2010-11 after serving on the board of directors for four-and-a-half years. Carolyn previously co-chaired several League committees including Technology, Freshplace, Backpack, and Community Grants and was a member of the Golf Committee and Technology Task Force. She has participated in several Show Houses serving on the Show House public relations, program, and staffing committees. In addition to her Leadership Greater Hartford nomination, Carolyn will continue to serve on the Junior League of Hartford's Finance committee. In 2011, Carolyn was selected to serve as a coordinator for the Association of Junior Leagues International's mid-sized Leagues across four countries. This position will continue until 2014.

Outside of the Junior League of Hartford, she is the chair of the Clover Street School Governance Council. She also serves on the Windsor Early Childhood Council, where she has previously co-chaired the Childhood Services Expo Committee. Carolyn recently concluded three terms on the Policy Board of the First Church Early Learning Center in Windsor and continues to be actively involved in both of her children's schools. Carolyn holds a Master's Degree in European History from George Mason University.
